<b>SBIRT Sub-Committee Update (Kari Keller/Shelby Kuhn)</b>	<p>-There will be two trainings in August for schools to implement SBIRT: August 2<sup>nd</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup> and August 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>. All public schools in the county are involved except for Kohler and Howards Grove. Kiel may be added.</p> <p>-Cindy is working with Kristin and Tom M. on referral to treatment. They are hoping the brief intervention will be enough for a lot of kids.</p> <p>-The committee just reviewed their work plan and they are doing very well with the current CHIP objectives.</p> <p>-Schools can also do mental health first aid to help identify people to SBIRT trained staff at schools.</p>

Barriers include time and the possible pressure to correct the problems the results show.
